ENTRIES CLOSE: Wednesday, May 31, 2025 8:00 p.m. (MST) at the Trial Secretary's Address, after which time entries cannot be accepted, canceled, altered or substituted EXCEPT as provided for in Chapter 11, Section 6 of the Dog Show Rules.

SITE INFORMATION

Apex will allow unentered dogs, owned by exhibitors, ONLY dogs getting ready to run or using the warm-up jump area allowed on the turf. NO dogs are allowed to walk through the lobby area. PLEASE make sure you follow these rules.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds.

Dogs must be on lead at all times or confined to a crate except when competing or within the warm-up ring area.

NO FOOD VENDOR WILL BE AVAILABLE AT THIS EVENT

COURSE FAMILIARIZATION & TIMING

Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, during a walk-through period held prior to the start of the class. The walk-through is restricted to handlers entered in that class only.

A warm-up area, consisting of a regulation agility jump, may be provided for exhibitors. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the dog and not for training or relieving of the dog. Electronic timing devices will be used.

OBSTACLES

Obstacles will meet the specifications for obstacles in the current edition of the Regulations for Agility Trials. All classes will take place indoors on a turf surface. This trial will be held indoors, in a 90' x 110' turf ring.

HEIGHT DIVISIONS

Effective January 1, 2010, exhibitors are no longer required to provide proof to Trial Secretaries that their dog has a valid jump height card as part of the check-in process. Furthermore, this change eliminates the need for a copy of the jump height card to be submitted with an entry form. Dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form may still compete; but they must be measured/measured by the Judge of Record PRIOR to running in their class and this measurement will be valid for that weekend of trials only. However, if a Volunteer Measuring Official (VMO) or an Agility Field Rep is present; ALL dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form must be measured at some time during the trial or cluster of trials. This does not preclude having the dog measured by the Judge of Record if the VMO or Rep is not available to measure the dog before its first run of the trial or cluster of trials. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog measured prior to running and failure to do so will result in the cancellation of any qualifying scores.

If a VMO or Field Representative at a trial measures a dog into a height other than what they entered, the entry may be changed from Regular to Preferred or from Preferred to Regular, as long as the dog has not run any classes that day. If the dog has already run, the change may be made for the next trial day(s). The exhibitor must provide the Trial Secretary the AKC Agility Measurement Form when requesting the class change.

- All Measurements Are Effective Immediately
- Exception: Challenge Measurements to Permanent Jump Height Become Effective when Challenge Measurement Process is Complete (see Regulations)
- Dogs Entered in Preferred Classes Must Run in measured Height Division Must be moved up or down to proper height

AWARDS

Placement Ribbons will be awarded for the first through fourth place in each height division of each class for Standard Agility Classes and Jumpers with Weaves classes.

First Place Blue Ribbon

A green qualifying ribbon will be given to all qualifying dogs. Dogs must receive a qualifying score to receive placement awards.

CLASS CHANGES EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2020

Entering a Mixture of Regular and Preferred Classes Within the Same Trial Weekend

Multiple Jump Heights Within the Same Trial Day Effective January 1,

- 2020, exhibitors may enter a mixture of both Regular and Preferred classes on the same trial day and/or during a trial weekend. Any mixture of Regular and Preferred classes is allowed. Please note that if a dog qualifies in Regular Master Standard and Preferred Master JWW (or vice versa) on the same trial day, then NO Double Q shall be earned toward either the MACH or PACH title. The Double Q still requires that Standard Agility and Jumpers With Weaves be either both Regular OR both Preferred on the same trial day.
- Additionally, within the same Regular or Preferred classes, a dog may now be entered in multiple jump heights within the same trial day. For example, the same dog may now be entered in 20-inch Master STD/JWW while also entered in 24C-inch Premier STD/JWW on the same trial day.
- A separate entry form must be submitted when the same dog is being entered in a mixture of Regular and Preferred and/or different jump heights within the same trial weekend thereby clearly indicating which class(es) and/or jump heights belong together for each trial day of the weekend.

FIX AND GO ON (FNG)

- Fix and Go On will be offered. FNG allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note. Using FNG will result in a non-qualifying score.
- Fix and Go On is not pre-entered; rather, it occurs during the course of the run.

ENTERING FOR EXHIBITION ONLY (FEO)

- For Exhibition Only will be offered. FEO will allow exhibitors to work with their dogs in a trial environment. FEO is allowed in the all classes. FEO will be of value to new exhibitors or exhibitors that are having difficulty with a specific obstacle and/or ring environment. Participation in FEO is non-qualifying.
- FEO runs are treated as trial entries. The exhibitor must enter the class(es) prior to the closing date, pay class entry fee(s) and the Trial Secretary must record the entry in the Trial Catalog as part of the results for that class. FEO does not need to be noted on the entry form; the handler will declare the day of the show.
- Dogs may be entered in any jump height for FEO runs. If entered in an ineligible jump height, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show jump height changes are not allowed.
- Dogs may be entered in any level of any class. If the dog is not eligible for the level entered, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show level changes are not allowed.
- The exhibitor must declare FEO in the ring prior to leading out. FEO may be declared earlier (ex. when checking in at the gate board).
- Toys are allowed in the ring

- Toys must be non-audible
- Toys may not leave the handler's hand
- Toys that roll freely cannot be used
- Food/treats are not allowed in the ring
- FEO should be utilized for the benefit of the dog and not as a punitive correction. Harsh verbal and /or physical corrections shall not be tolerated. Any determination of harshness by the judge shall be immediately whistled and the handler will be dismissed from the ring.
- A judge must monitor the entire run. Judges can stop a run at any time

AREA ACCOMMODATIONS

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY

- The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.
- It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. The Mountain States Dog Training Club and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. The Mountain States Dog Training Club.
- reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the Mountain States Dog Training Club or any official thereof.
- All dogs must be on leash at all times when on trial grounds except when in the designated warm-up area or competing on the course.
- All regulations governing the use of this facility, and all regulations and decisions of the trial committee at this trial will be strictly enforced, including and not limited to the recorded information in this premium list.
- Puppies under 4 months of age are prohibited at AKC Agility Trials.
- This club does not agree to arbitrate claims as set forth on the Official AKC entry form for this event.

ENTRY ELIGIBILITY

- Breeds Eligible: These Events are Accepting Entries All AKC Recognized Breeds & for All-American dogs listed in the AKC Canine Partners program. All dogs fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number, or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate. Wherever the word "dog" is used in these regulations it includes both sexes.
- Dogs should be physically sound. Dogs that are blind shall not be eligible, and neither are bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. No dog shall compete if it is taped or bandaged in any way or has anything attached to it for medical purposes. Refer to Chapter 2 of the Registration and Discipline Rules for the listing of registerable breeds that may participate. Unentered dogs may be asked to leave the trial grounds.

REFUNDS

- No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee.
- No refunds for overpayment of \$10.00 or less.
- Change of judge, after the distribution of the premium list, if the judging assignment changes, an exhibitor has the right to request a full refund of their entry fees for any class affected. Exhibitors must submit requests in writing to the Trial Secretary a minimum of 30 minutes preceding the start of the event on the first day the exhibitor is entered.
- Bitches in season are not permitted to compete in AKC Agility Trials. Chapter 1, Section 9 of the Regulations for Agility Trials, <http://images.akc.org/pdf/rulebooks/REAGIL.pdf>, states, "Females in season must be fully refunded if withdrawn by the Trial Secretary after closing and no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class of the day of the trial. The club may retain a processing fee and must publish

this information in the premium (no fee is paid to the American Kennel Club for females in season who are withdrawn). A \$10.00/ entered day processing fee will be withheld for entries withdrawn due to a bitch being reported in season.

RINGSIDE

- Judge are not required to wait for dogs. The owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at ringside when it is to be judged. The club has no responsibility for providing service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the pupose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

CRATING and SEATING

- Ample crating spaces will be available.
- A clean mat or trap is required under ALL kennels and crates.
- Crating areas will be designated by the club. No crating will be allowed in front of any doors or blocking halls.
- Please be courteous and do not take more space than you need. MSDTC has the right to make crating area changes to benefit the trial and exhibit needs. Bleacher seating is available.
- Crates maybe left overnight, however, Mountain States Dog Training club and the Apex Field House will not be responsible for any lost or damage items left at the show site.

SITE INFORMATION

- Apex will allow unentered dogs, owned by exhibitors, BUT no unentered dogs will be allowed on the turf due to concerns of crowding. No dogs are allowed to walk through the lobby area. The facility is very concern about contact between the children and dogs. *PLEASE makes sure you follow these rules.*
- Do not allow your dog to relieve itself on the flowers, landscaping or rock area along the walk ways and building surroundings. The fabric under the rock will retain the urine smell.
- Dog treats that DO NOT crumble will be allowed on the turf area. People cannot eat food on the turf area. Apex is permitting us to do this on a trial basis. Please do not drop your treats on the turf or take advantage of this privilege. Only dogs getting ready to run are allowed on the turf.

PARKING

- Exhibitors are governed by any rules or regulations of civil authorities and building and parking regulations. Vehicles parked contrary to regulations will be subject to towing at owner's expense.
- PLEASE NOTE: A limited number of handicap spaces are available. They will be available on a first-come basis. A valid handicap plate must be on each vehicle using these spaces. THESE SPACES WILL NOT ACCOMMODATE MOTOR HOMES.
- Club officials may require that vehicles or equipment be rearranged to accommodate additional vehicles. Area around vehicles MUST be kept clean at all times. All vehicles will be parked at owner's risk. Apex Field Houses and Mountain States Dog Training Club will not be responsible for loss by burglary, fire, or any other cause whatsoever to the vehicle or its contents.

INSTRUCTIONS

Handlers whose dogs measure into the 8" through 20" regular jump height divisions may opt to enter in a higher or 24-choice **height division** for all **Regular** titling classes, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. Dogs who measure into the 24" regular jump height division may not enter 24-choice. Dogs entered in the **Preferred** classes **must** compete at the required jump height and **may not** compete in a jump height division **higher or lower** than their proper height division.

All dogs that have not been officially measured for an **Agility Jump Height Card** may still compete; however, they must be measured by a Judge of record, an Agility Field Representative, or a Volunteer Measuring Official, prior to running. If measured by the Judge of record, that measurement will be valid for this trial or **back-to-back trials** only. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running.

Dogs listed in the **AKC Canine Partners ProgramSM** may be eligible to enter all-breed AKC agility trials at the club's option. These dogs should be listed as All American Dog and must include their AKC number on the entry form and check the AKC No. box.

Junior Handlers should enter their Junior Handler Number on the front of this form. Should you not have your Junior Handler number, it may be obtained from the American Kennel Club (919) 233-9767. If the Junior Handler is not the owner of the dog identified on the face of this form, what is the relationship of the Junior Handler to the Owner?
